Year 1 Research Local Impact (Oxford)

Project

- Learn and apply research skills
- Develop understanding of ethical research
- Join an interdisciplinary team, you will undertake a 6-week community-level research project within Oxford and Oxfordshire
- Work in collaboration with a designated local stakeholder (e.g. local school) on a group research project
- Write-up an impact-driven research paper and academic poster
- Publish the research on the Laidlaw Scholars Network
- Present at an international conference

You will be supported by SDG Impact Lab Faculty and staff for the full scope of the project activities and deliverables.

The SDG Impact Lab will provide support for you to design and develop a self-guided global impact and leadership project around the world.

You will be encouraged to work in collaboration with other Laidlaw Scholars from the global network.

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Character Growth

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6 online workshops

Scholars will participate in six live, online Leadership Workshops delivered by the Oxford Character Project.

Over the course of the programme (18 months)

The workshops and training sessions will cover a wide range of topics focusing on character qualities that are essential for becoming ethical leaders, such as purpose, growth, love, integrity, and practical wisdom. At the end of each workshop, there will be an ethical leadership challenge for the Scholars to practice what they have learned and exchange ideas with their fellow Scholars.

After successfully completing the programme, the scholars will receive certificates and access to additional resources that will help them to integrate various aspects of ethical leadership into their lives.

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Capacities Training

Leadership Capacities Seminars and Retreats

Over the course of the programme (18 months)

- 4 x research skills workshops taking you from how to ask a research question, developing a methodology, conducting ethical research to conducting meaningful analysis
- 4 x leadership seminars focussing on growing your ability to be an active citizen
- 2 x retreats focussing on leading with character

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
